



Justice Dr. AR. Lakshmanan

-Award Winner for outstanding judge and Champion of Social **Causes and Human Rights**

Shri AR Lakshmanan, son of Shri. L.AR.Arunachalam Chettiar, is one of the distinguished and eminent Indian hailing from the district of Sivaganga in Tamil Nadu. Born on 22/03/1942, Shri.Lakshmanan, even as a school student, developed a strong passion to join the judiciary. He used to read with keen interest, all the court Judgements reported in the newspapers. He blazed through his academic studies to graduate in Economics from St.Joseph's College, Trichy. Following his heart's dictates, he completed Bachelor of Law from Madras Law College in the year 1966.



It was the hands of the then Chief Justice K. Veerasamy that led him into the portals of what turned out to be a most distinguished judicial career. While attending a function in Devakottai at the invitation of AR Lakshmanan, Shri. Veerasamy persuaded AR Lakshmanan's father to send him to Chennai to embark on a legal career. This set him on his career course.

AR Lakshmanan enrolled as a Lawyer on 10th Jan 1968 and served as Junior under eminent lawyers Shri.G.Ramanjuan, Shri.K.Venkataswami and R.Krishnamurthy before starting to practice on his own. He had independent practice in varied branches of Law including Civil, Criminal, Company Law, Taxation, Insolvency, Trade Marks and Patents Law, Matrimonial, Admiralty, Writ jurisdiction etc.

After serving as a Lawyer for 23 years, Shri. AR Lakshmanan was appointed as Government Pleader for Tamil Nadu to represent their matters in the Madras High Court and Supreme Court. His knowledge and skills as well as the meticulous preparation and hard work he put in to argue various matters were noticed and appreciated by all. In 1990, he was appointed by the President of India as a Permanent Judge in Madras High Court. After 7 ½ years of tenure in this position, he was transferred to Kerala High



Court. From there he went on to serve as Chief Justice at High Courts at Rajasthan and Andhra Pradesh. He was finally elevated as a Judge of Supreme Court in the year 2002.

During his tenures as Judge, Justice at High Court and Justice at Supreme Court he has delivered more than 98000 Judgements !!! His legal acumen reflected in each and every one of his judgement.


Many of them have been recognised and appreciated as thought Provoking Judgements in the history of Indian Judiciary. The land mark Judgement delivered by him as a member of a Division Bench which banned smoking in public places is the one considered by him as an important Judgement.

He retired as a Judge of the Supreme Court in 2007 and was appointed as Chairman of the 18th Law Commission of India. In a short span before retirement from this post in 2009, he had submitted 32 reports to the Government of India recommending various measures to improve the Judicial System in India.

It is natural that the service of a person of the calibre of Shri.AR Lakshmanan is much sought after by various Judicial, quasi-Judicial and non-Judicial institutions. He was the secretary of Madras Bar Association four times, the founder-chancellor of the National Law University at odhpur, Revising author of Wharton's Law Lexicon (15th Edition), Editorial member in Indian Law Institute, Delhi, Chairman of COFEPOSA Advisory Board and Chairman of NSA Advisory Board. He served as Legal Advisor for Bank of Madura, City Union Bank, Canara Bank, IOB, New India Assurance Company and was the standing counsel for University of Madras, Food Corporation of India, MGR Medical University at various times.

He recognised that, to dispose of the large pendancy of cases in courts, alternative disputes resolution methods have to be promoted. This made him to take special interest in arbitration system. He has served as arbitrator in Indian Council of Arbitrators (Judge's

category) and also as memberpanel arbitrator in International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR), New Delhi. Incidentally, he was nominated as the Representative of the State of Tamil Nadu to the Empowered Committee constituted by the Supreme Court to resolve the dispute with regard to the Mullai Periyar Dam between States of Kerala and Tamil Nadu.



Like others from Nattukottai Nagarathar Community (Chettiars), he has deep social commitment and spends considerable time and efforts to improve the welfare of the people.

As one may expect, awards and felicitations were showered upon him by the grateful Indian Community in recognition of his distinguished services as an outstanding judge and Champion of Social Causes and Human Rights. THE ICE CREAM ICON

"The heights of great men reached and kept, Were not attained by sudden flight. For they, while their companions slept, Were toiling upwards in the night."

In the annals of Indian businessmen, there are several success stories of those who rose from humble beginnings and reached the pinnacle of success by their hard work, sincerity, determination, innovative skill, courage, integrity, honesty, vision and human relations.



One such inspiring story is that of Mr.R.G.Chandramogan, Chairman and Managing Director of Hatsun Agro Product Ltd., manufacturers of the famous ARUN brand ice cream. With indomitable will power and unshakable faith in perseverance, he crossed several hurdles, before he was able to establish his brand of ice cream as a household name in south India.

THE BEGINNING:

Mr.Chandramogan, son of a vegetable wholesaler from Tamilnadu, discontinued his college studies in the pre-university stage and in 1970, at the suggestion of his maternal uncle, set up Arun Ice cream in Chennai with a resolve 'to do something worthwhile'.

With his own capital of Rs.15,000 and a bank loan of Rs.21,000, the business was started and in the very first year, recorded a turnover of Rs.1.5 lakhs and profit of Rs.40,000. In a market dominated by well-known brands of ice creams like Kwality, Dasaprakash and Joy, it was not an easy task for Chandramogan to penetrate into the market and capture a decent market share.

To take on the competition, he had to devise innovative marketing strategies and explore new avenues. While the big brands concentrated on sales through deepfreezer based general stores, where the deep freezers were financed by the ice cream companies, supplies to hotels and to weddings and other social events, mainly in Chennai, Chandramogan decided to expand his Arun ice cream market in college canteens (like IIT College canteen) and educational institutions and also to ships which berthed in Chennai



port. Since these avenues were not tapped by the other brands, Arun ice cream had a very good response and in view of its quality, taste, different flavours and reasonable cost, it became very popular.

NEW HORIZONS:

The next innovative move was to move into nearby districts and suburban centres, where there was a good demand for ice cream, but due to supply constraints and logistical

bottlenecks, the big players were hesitant to enter. At this stage, in order to sharpen his marketing and human relations skills and update his knowledge, Chandramogan took up a course on Marketing and Personnel Management at the Davar's College. His next foray was into important centres away from Chennai, like Madurai, Pondicherry, Kumbakonam, Sivaganga and others, where he appointed agents, who sold ice cream



through "Sit and Eat Parlours." "Ice cream supplied from Madras" was the slogan, with which the franchise outlets at district centres did roaring business. Chandramogan's strict criteria for the selection of franchisees and business background and those who are in early twenties, completed schooling and failed in early business endeavours, ensured that he was able to mobilise a band of dedicated, resourceful, hardworking and enthusiastic young men who put their heart and soul into the business and make it successful. The franchisees were so impressed with the policies and dynamism of the company, that many of them named their sons as "Arun". By 1985, Hatsun became the largest manufacturer of ice creams in Tamilnadu.

INTEGRATION WITH MILK PRODUCERS:

While the seventies was a period of learning, the eighties was a period of growth. Since the regular, adequate and cost-effective supply of quality milk is a pre-requisite for ice cream manufacture, Chandramogan introduced the scheme of direct purchase of milk from dairy farmers in milk producing villages through milk collection centres.

With this holistic approach, it was possible to increase the production of ice cream and devise new marketing strategies. To cope up with increasing demand, a new plant was set up in Salem (Tamilnadu) in 1991. Arun introduced 7 to 10 new flavours of ice creams every month and at any given time, 35 flavours of ice cream were available at the Arun Ice cream parlours.



INNOVATIVE IDEAS:

To make the Arun brand more popular, new marketing techniques, as stated below, were employed-

- i) EAT ALL YOU CAN MELA, where for a payment of Rs.8/-, one can eat as much ice cream as he wants and the one who eats the maximum quantity gets a prize..
- ii) SLOW SPEED DRIVING COMPETITION for two-wheelers, the competition starting from Arun ice cream parlours. The participants purchase ice creams for Rs.15/-. The winner in the competition gets a prize.
- iii) PHONE AND HAVE AN ICE CREAM Members of the public dial specified phone numbers during given time slots and win ice cream for Rs.100/-.

These sales promotion strategies took the Arun icecream brand name into the nooks and corners of Tamilnadu and neighbouring states.

MARKET EXPANSION:

With the sales graphs showing an encouraging upward trend, new technological upgradation was necessary to cater to the increasing sales. By 1995, Arun ice cream was transported to all its outlets in the four southern states by refrigerated vehicles, to ensure that the customers get fresh stocks every day. A new depot was also opened in Madurai, in 1995, to speed up delivery to the southern parts of Tamilnadu and neighbouring states.

ADVERTISEMENT AND COST CONTROL:

With a carefully planned, advertising campaign, sales strategies and innovative competitions, the Arun brand name was popularised and by early nineties, it was a well-known brand in South India. Mr.Chandramogan carefully avoided extravagant advertisements and confined his campaign only to his target customers in selected areas. With strict control on expenses, Hatsun's distribution cost was kept as low as 7%, as



against 9% of his competitors. This was one of the important factors that contributed to better efficiency.

MANAGEMENT:

Realising the importance of technological and managerial resources for the company, Mr.Chandramogan recruited well-qualified ice cream technologists, personnel and



management experts to build a cohesive team that would ensure a productive labour force with cordial relations. With such result-oriented employees, the company is constantly in search of innovative strategies to improve its market share.

CHALLENGES:

The de-reservation, in 1992, of ice cream manufacture from the list of products for exclusive development by small-scale industries and the entry of international marketing giants like Unilever into the ice cream market posed new challenges to the Arun brand, but by that time, Hatsun had established its network so well in the south that it was able to face the competition successfully and scale new heights of sales and profits. Today, Arun is a household name in ice cream in Tamilnadu and also neighbouring states and today it is the market leader of South India.

"Great heights attract us, not the steps leading to them" Behind the success story of Arun ice cream, there are several layers of sacrifice, sincerity, courage of conviction, farsighted vision, planning, creative ideas, innovative strategies and above all, the determination to succeed, crossing all obstacles by one man Mr.R.G.Chandramogan. His life teaches many lessons for all young entrepreneurs who wish to start a new business and make a success of it. He is a role model, worthy of being emulated.



- I make these promises solemnly, freely and upon my honour.

If there one Doctor who has made it his life's mission to live by each and every word of these solemn pledges, it is Dr. Nampoory who is a Consultant Nephrologist and Transplant Physician working in the Ministry of Health in Kuwait for more than 22 years now. Dr. Nampoory, presently Chairman, is also the Founder and twice elected President of Indian Doctors Forum in Kuwait.

"I have no more desires or ambitions in life. God has given me and my family everything that we need. My life is filled with happiness and contentment. I consider that my foremost duty is service to humanity" so says a modest Dr. Nampoory, when we met him.

Dr. Nampoory belongs to Ramamangalam village in Moovaattupuzha District in Kerala. His illustrious father Sri. Raman Nampoory devoted his entire life and wealth to serve the people. Himself a not much educated person, he wanted others to get what life had denied to him i.e. education.

He, therefore, started a school in his village. He did not stop there. He made substantial financial and space contribution for setting up a post office, a police station, a cooperative society and also a panchayat office in his Ramamangalam, which was a remote village with no such facilities before.

"In those days, my father was a staunch Congress worker. As a committed member of the party, he had devoted his life to social service. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India had sent a personal letter of appreciation to my father then. We preserved that letter and are continuously inspired by those words. We are proud that the public service attitude of my father has been genetically transmitted to his children" so says a beaming and proud Dr. Nampoory.

Dr. Nampoory is the 6th child of 9 siblings. His father not only gave all of them good education but provided this opportunity to many other children who hailed from in and around that village, irrespective of their caste or creed.

If someone in the village was caught stealing, his father, instead of punishing him, would enquire into the reason for indulging in such a criminal act, and then would extend financial help to him so that he does not commit the same crime again. Dr. Nampoory has grown up witnessing such large heartedness and the spirit of public service, which he has also imbibed in abundant measure from his father.

It was not possible to send the 10 children to hostel for their education since the only income then used to be from farming and agriculture traditionally. So all of them studied in their village which offered education only in Malayalam medium.

After his schooling, Dr. Nampoory used to walk 6 kilometres each way which included crossing a river using a rowing boat, to pursue his Pre Degree Course. It was only when he started his medical education that he wore Chappals for the first time in his life.

New dress were rare and reserved for occasions like Onam festival and school commencement.

Thus Dr. Nampoory has come up the hard way in life and empathises with the poor and downtrodden strata of the society. He won a scholarship for his medical studies. However, since the scholarship amount came



from the taxes that people have paid, Dr. Nampoory considers his foremost duty to repay this by serving the people.

With God's blessings, he completed his MBBS degree with top honours from Kottayam Medical College. He was in the 6th batch of medical students graduated from this College. Subsequently, he completed his MD degree from CMC, Vellore.

His academic pursuits did not end there. In 1977, after completing his Internal medicine course, he served as a Lecturer in Kottayam Medical College. Thereafter, he went to PGI, Chandigarh to pursue a course on "Nephrology". Thereafter, he secured a National Board Degree from All India Institute of Medical Sciences in New Delhi.

Amongst the siblings, only one is an Engineer, his youngest brother Dinesan who also works in Kuwait. All others are engaged in teaching profession in professional colleges and schools. Dr. Nampoory was also very keen to pursue a career in teaching. And this prompted him to take up the position of Associate Professor in Kottayam and Calicut Medical Colleges till he left Kerala.

This experience in teaching took him to Saudi Arabia where from 1983-86 he taught in



the Dammam and Al Khobar Hospitals. During this period, on the recommendation of the Government of Saudi Arabia, he set up Dialysis units in 6 centres in different regions there. Dr. Nampoory recalls this experience with pride in his eyes.

In 1988, he then moved to Kuwait for an assignment in the Health Ministry. Thereafter, he served as the Head of Nephrology unit in Mubarak Hospital for 16 years with Prof K V Johny. At present he is working as a Senior Consultant in the Transplant Nephrology Unit of Hamad Al Essa Organ Transplant Centre.

The main inspiration and the strength of Dr. Nampoory are his father, his attitude and experience. This goaded him to set up the Indian Doctors' Forum in Kuwait with the purpose of undertaking community services in a legal manner as per the law of the land. He took the initiative to promote this idea and get a number of Doctors on Board.

The Indian Embassy had granted the recognition after 75 doctors have registered in the forum in May 2004. Very soon the roster of the forum swelled and this is how the IDF was started. Over the next nine years IDF grew in length and breadth. Valuable and heavy contributions from past Presidents like Dr.Ramesh Pandita and Dr. Riaz Khan, present President Dr Amir Ahmed and General Secretaries Dr. Jaganathan, Dr Murali Gopal, Dr George Varghese and many other noble, sincere, hardworking doctors are the main pillars for its unimaginable growth. Previous ambassadors, present ambassador His Excellency the Ambassador of India to Kuwait Mr. Satish C Mehta and all officials of Indian Embassy in Kuwait had been very helpful to IDF.

IDF received the prestigious PBD Samman on January 9th 2013 .On its behalf Dr Nampoory, Chairman of IDF, received it from Hon President of India, His Excellency Sri Pranab Kumar Mukherjee in front of an august gathering at Kochi.

IDF it is affiliated to the Kuwait Medical Association (KMA). KMA is a recognized body by both Ministry of Health and Ministry of Social Affairs in Kuwait. KMA has been extremely helpful in IDF's many social and community activities. This affiliation helped IDF gain a recognized and a legal status in Kuwait.

Dr. Nampoory elaborates the three purposes in forming the IDF.

The first is to undertake community services in a legal manner as per the law of the land. The community service includes conducting Medical Seminars, organizing medical camps, Health awareness programs in schools, organizing workshops in schools to increase the awareness among children on the ill effects of smoking, benefits of immunization and immunizations schedules, conducting first aid camps, CPR training etc.

Usually IDF conducts around 8-9 medical camps on yearly basis where about 1500 people are attended to by 50-60 doctors. Also IDF arranges a session called Meet the Specialist. In this session IDF invites specialists from various medical disciplines, who give a presentation on their subject of specialization but in simple and layman's language.

Then there is a Q & A session wherein the audience are encouraged to ask questions


here that Satish came in contact with higher principle of life like peace within one self, being amicable with all.



"As a young boy, growing up in a small village in rural India, I was always convinced that if there were any changes to be made in my life, it would have to come solely through my own efforts. Life in those days was a rollercoaster ride of highs and lows. Being the only son, among seven other siblings in a conservative Muslim family, responsibilities came my way very early in life. But from the onset I was determined that no matter where destiny took me, I would make the best of the destinations I landed in.

And so it was that in January of 1977 I landed in Kuwait."

'Destiny's Destination...' traces the exciting and extraordinary journey of Mr. Khan, as a young man from Sihali Jagir, a small village in India's Uttar Pradesh state, to a successful businessman and eminent personality among Indians in Kuwait. The book documents Mr. Khan's rare ability to meaningfully touch other people's lives, a gift he has carefully cultivated during his three decades of stay in the country. As Mr. Khan says in the foreword to

'Destiny's Destination...' "This book is not only a journal capturing the heartwarming experiences, documenting some historical, at times poignant memories; it is also an expression of the heart... "The concept for compiling a book of this nature began in early 2009; the idea eventually evolved into 'Destiny's Destination...' This photo anthology of my journey through life

provided an amazing opportunity to indelibly record the many enlivening relationships that I have nurtured with a wide section of people in India and Kuwait. Three decades or more, from when they were first taken, these images still manage to awaken strong feelings, and to recall events and moments that have tenaciously clung to the walls of my memory."

 $^{\rm N}I$ began photographing as a hobby at the age of 15, when I was presented with an old Nikon camera. The thousands of photographs that I



had accumulated since then were lying around in old albums, envelopes and cardboard boxes. Some were discolored, some were dog-eared around the corners and some had distinct crease marks from inadvertent folds, and from being stuffed into overflowing containers. Obviously, I thought to myself, something had to be done to preserve these images for the future and to disseminate it to a wider audience."

While one way to safeguard old photographs would be to scan and store them permanently on electronic media, the idea of uploading images to a website and sharing the link with friends and relatives did not appeal to Mr. Khan. "To me, sharing photographs is a collective experience among friends and family. There is something special about sitting around a family table turning pages in an album or book, while commenting on this or that photograph, that simply cannot be replicated by sitting in front of a monitor and clicking through photographs. So the idea of publishing the images in a book form came to



pass. Sharing this book with old acquaintances and friends has often meant being involved in an enriching communal experience with kindred souls."

The book, which is presented in a lavish coffee-table book format, was released in New Delhi on 6th January, 2010, by author and former Indian Minister of State for External Affairs, Shashi Tharoor. The glittering book launch ceremony was attended by a galaxy of senior government officials, VIPs and several prominent Indians from Kuwait, who lauded Mr. Khan for compiling this photographic compendium of milestones in the long and

remarkable relations between India

and Kuwait.


'Destiny's Destination...' chronicles numerous historical events that took place in the last forty odd years, which have played a significant role fostering harmonious relations

He is the youngest of four children to his parents, eldest sister – Gomathi Muniandi, now enjoying retired life since two years, after three decades of work with HR & CE Dept., Tamilnadu, next sister – Rajam Sivasubramanian, is a homemaker and elder brother – Govindan Shanmugam, is an Addl. Director with CW & PRS, Govt. of India, Pune.

Born in the year 1958, a hyperactive boy, he was admitted in school at a very young age. His elementary schooling was at Kalingaperi village near Rajapalayam and high schooling at PACM High School, Rajapalayam, where he was the 1973 topper in SSLC. 

Subsequently he worked as Pediatrician and Neonatologist with Ministry of Health, Oman's prestigious hospital Khoula Hospital at Muscat for 10 years.

Not only writing on his own research papers, he is the reviewer of various medical journals for medical articles in Oman Medical Journal.



With the background of medical teaching and research, he started various training programme in Basic Life support, Lactational management and Neonatal resuscitation programme for the Ministry of Health Khoula Hospital, Oman.

When the opportunity to establish the Indian based Apollo Hospital group in Kuwait came as Yiaco Apollo Medical Center he took this challenge and joined in 2004. His wife Meena Prabhakar, a post graduate is a home maker. Her


supportive nature and determined thoughts has helped in a long way to achieve his desired goals.




the company. He has been fortunate enough to witness the implementation of the wise and benevolent policies of the Rulers of this country that has made Kuwait what it is today.

Sam Alphonsa



After the Invasion, when he came back there was nothing left, everything was taken away by the fleeing Iragis and Bhagwan has to start from the scratch all over once again.

The company named HADIDCO is his brainchild and today has a huge store, where he stores all his mild steel and rolled products. His store is the biggest in Shuwaikh and he has 30 employees under him. He imports steel from all over the world and sells locally. His staff consists of people from different countries. Today, Bhagwan is a successful businessman and a devoted husband and father.

He lives in Kuwait with his wife and his children are away in Dubai and Australia.



Valerine M. D'sa





However, having watched my father strive successfully to make his dream of providing affordable health service to NRI workers in Gulf become a concrete reality, I had a keen desire to join him in this noble venture driven by a social objective".

While Ms.Naziha had studied in Coimbatore and had got her BBM degree in International Business as well as a diploma in multi-media, her father had more advice for her. "Business acumen requires one to have strong mental strength and maturity and an ability to read and understand other people's mind for better inter-personal skills". So, Ms.Naziha studied Psychology at University of Cambridge. She also participated in many personality development programmes winning accolades every time.





Ms.Naziha's dad used to tell her "Have a smile and exhibit a pleasant looking face always which will help to create a good atmosphere and result the better among best. We should not expose our angry or problems to others."

She worked in a private company in Dubai to experience the ground realities as a new entrant in a commercial organization before joining her father's business at Shifa Al-Jazeera as vice-chairman. She was told by her father not to expect any special privilege in the company or develop an ego because of her executive position. There was no fear of that happening anyway. With people like her father Dr.K.T.Rabiullah and ex-president of India Dr.Kalam being her role model, Ms.Naziha likes simplicity and sincerity in all her actions.

When questioned about her assuming a challenging job position at such an young





age, she says, "Neither my young age nor my lack of previous experience in medical field was a mental block for me; Thanks to my father, I have developed strong character and a willingness to face any situation with a cool head and an analytical mind as expected of a senior executive".

Ms.Naziha always respects the workers and listens to the opinions of senior technicians with an open

mind. "I make it a point to meet all their reasonable expectations and keep them happy". Perhaps, that is the reason why patients at Shifa Al-Jazeera find every staff and employee of the hospital carrying out their duties and responsibilities with full zeal and enthusiasm.

She considers the annual checkup service offered by the company to all patients for early detection and treatment of disease to achieve a better success rate of cure as a key measure aimed to raise the level of health and fitness of the people. 
the daughter of the restaurant owner as it made her talk quite easy. There was immediate acceptance of her ideas from the staff.

Arjuna Awardee Deepa Malik

DEEPA MALIK is not remarkable because she is an army officer's wife who loves bikes, nor it is uncomman for a 42-year-old parent to love high-altitude


driving and swimming in rivers. While it is amazing that Malik does these things without her legs. Deepa Malik is an Indian swimmer, biker and athlete. She is a paraplegic. She has won numerous accolades for her participation in various adventure sports.

Deepa Malik belongs to an out and out Army background; she is the wife of Colonel (Retired) Bikram Malik, who served the Armoured Corps in one of the oldest regiments - The Scinde Horse. In order to devote full attention to his wife, he sought voluntary retirement soon after finishing command of his



regiment in 2006. Deepa's father Colonel (Retired) BK Nagpal served with the Grenadiers, yet another prestigious Infantry regiment of the Indian Army. Her father-in-law, Major General (Retired) BS Malik commanded the same regiment as her husband – The Scinde Horse.

Deepa was born as a normal healthy child in 1970; in 1977, she suffered from tumours 95 along the spine and recovered after surgery and extensive physiotherapy. She got married in 1989 but her condition started worsening once again in 1989. She underwent two surgeries in the Army Research and Referral Hospital, rated amongst the best in the country, but did not recover and was paralysed from the waist and below. It was a tough time for Malik family. Her husband Bikram Singh Malik was fighting the Kargil war and at home Deepa was struggling with her tumors. Finally the family won both the war. India won Kargil. Despite three spinal tumour surgeries and 183 stitches between shoulder





Deepa has very severe international disability category termed as F53 which covers chest below paralysis. Her condition translates into complete paralysis below the chest with zero sensation in the afflicted areas, no bladder and bowel control, half the lungs inflated, poor body temperature control and



blood circulation and no torso balance. Only her arms and shoulders are functional but three spinal surgeries and about 180 stitches between her shoulder blades in upper spinal region making long sitting, training and driving with arms more challenging. In addition, she has to continuously undergo tumour management treatment which is extremely draining her health and energy.

Right from the word go, Deepa was not ready to allow her disability to come in the way of leading a normal life. She tied ropes all along below the roof in the rooms of her house and performed household duties, looking after her husband and two lovely daughters. She

also created a successful business at Ahmednagar in Maharashtra, where her in-laws had built a house and were living post retirement. Ahmednagar is the training centre of the Armoured Corps and has a large presence of the Corps fraternity.

At the age of 36, Deepa felt that she had to do something more to fight her unfortunate condition and for this she started looking towards sports and motivational activities. In less than six years, she has become an international sports person. She has won 39 Gold, Four Silver and two Bronze medals at the national and State levels apart from being the first sportswoman to represent India at the international level in her category of disability. In 2010 her world ranking, in her category of disability, was second in Shot-put, third in discus and third in Javelin and Asian ranking was first in all three categories.

She is also the first paraplegic woman biker and a car rallyist. In March 2010, she successfully completed the very difficult Desert Storm motor vehicle rally; a journey of almost 3000 km through breath taking desert landscapes and the toughest terrain, an








unprecedented feat of endurance and courage. Whether it is swimming against the strong Yamuna current, or riding a special bike or even taking a shot at the Paralympics, she has done it all. She is a Limca Book record holder for feats of swimming, biking and driving.

The President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee awarded Deepa Malik with the Arjuna Award for Athletics (Paralympics) during the National Sports Awards 2012 held at the Rashtrapati Bhawan on Wednesday, August, 29, 2012. This coveted award recognises excellence in sports. The gritty athlete was greeted with the loudest applause as she went forward to accept the award.

Kalpana Saroj

From child bride to multi-millionaire in India

Kalpana Saroj heads Kamani Tubes, a company worth more than \$100m

Kalpana Saroj's is a real life story of determination, perseverance, bravery, tenacity and indomitable courage of a lone woman fighter who rose from the lowest strata of life to capture the ivory towers. She is strong, resolute, tough, spirited and at the same time has a tender heart which instantly reaches out to help the needy. No doubt the icon that young ladies look forward to be, she was recently awarded the Rajiv Gandhi Award for Woman Entrepreneurs.



When the workers of Kamani Tubes Limited approached her for help, the Company was registered as a sick industrial unit

under SICA, and was in the BIFR. The company had been lying closed for over 17 years and rest is history. Braving heavy litigation Kalpana Saroj nursed the sick Kamani back to health.

After Kalpana Saroj took over the management of Kamani, she paid the workers dues at the outset, and thereafter the dues of the secured creditors and other statutory dues. 99 The new factory of the company has since been inaugurated at Wada in Maharashtra at the hands of the Hon. Minister for Forest, Mr. Babanrao Pachpute. To cut a long story short, when bigwigs failed to turn around a sick company, Kalpana Saroj simply succeeded!

Business apart, Kalpana Saroj has keen interest in Education. All the year round more than 2000 students are benefited through services rendered by institutions sponsored by her which provide library, hostel and financial help to the needy students.

Kalpana Saroj works actively for the up-liftment of the Adivasis, destitute children,



aged and infirm. She takes up the cudgel against racism and caste discrimination. Kalpana Saroj's efforts for the upliftment of the downtrodden masses has been eulogized in the local as well as international press and Television time and again

An Indian Dalit (formerly untouchable) woman, who once attempted suicide to escape discrimination, poverty and physical

abuse, becomes the CEO of a multi-million dollar company.



Her life reads like the plot of a Bollywood film, with a narrative which has defied so many obstacles, to conclude with a happy ending.

The "rags to riches" cliche can be overused, but it goes some way in describing the story of Kalpana Saroj, a woman who struggled on so many occasions on her way to the top.



Born into a low-caste Dalit family, she was bullied at school, forced into marriage at the age of 12, fought social pressures to leave her husband, before she tried to take her own life.

Today, she is a multi-millionaire. At the helm of a successful company, she rubs shoulders with prominent businessmen and has won awards for her professionalism.

"The first time I came to Mumbai, I did not even know where to go. I was from such a small village. Today my company has two roads named after it in the city," she says, summing up the extent to which her life has transformed.

India's caste system is an ancient social hierarchy, which places people into different categories by birth. Those born into the lower castes have historically faced discrimination.

"Some of my friend's parents would not let me in their homes, and I was not even allowed to participate in some school activities because I was a Dalit," says the 52-year-old.

"I used to get angry. I felt really nervous because I thought even I am a human being," she adds.

Marital woes

Even though her father allowed her to get an education, wider family pressures saw Kalpana become a bride at the age of 12. She moved to Mumbai to be with her husband who was 10 years older, but was shocked to find herself living in a slum. But that was not the only hardship she had to endure.



"I was treated badly by my husband's elder brother and his wife. They would pull my hair and beat me, sometimes over little things. I felt broken with all the physical and verbal abuse," she says.



Leaving a husband is widely frowned upon in Indian culture, but Kalpana was able to escape the violent relationship, thanks to her supportive father. When he visited her in Mumbai, he was shocked to see his daughter emaciated and wearing torn clothes and took her back home. Many villagers were suspicious of her return, viewing Kalpana as a failure.



She tried to ignore the misjudgemental comments thrown at her, focusing instead on getting a job. She learnt tailoring as a way to make money. But, even with some degree of financial independence, the pressure became too much.

"One day, I decided to end my life. I drank three bottles of insecticide, termite poison," she says, recalling her lowest moment. Kalpana was saved after her aunt walked into the room and found her frothing at the mouth and shaking uncontrollably.

The big change

It marked a watershed for her. "I decided to live my life, and do something big, and then die," she says. So, at the age of 16, she moved back to Mumbai to stay with her uncle and work as a tailor.

She began by earning less than a dollar a month, but tirelessly learnt how to operate industrial sewing machines, and as a result saw her income rise. But the money she earned was not enough to pay for her sister's treatment which could have saved her life, a moment which defined Kalpana's entrepreneurial spirit.

"I was highly disappointed and realised that money did matter in life, and that I needed to make more." She took a government loan to open a furniture business and expand her tailoring work.

She worked 16 hours a day, a routine she has not managed to shake off to this day. In the following years, she remarried, this time to a fellow furniture businessman, and had two children. Her reputation led to her being asked to take over the running of a metal engineering company, Kamani Tubes, which was in massive debt. By restructuring the company, she turned things around.

"I wanted to give justice to the people who were working there. I had to save the company. I could relate to the staff who needed to put food on the table for their family," she says of her motivations at the time.

Now, Kamani Tubes is a growing business, worth more than \$100m. Kalpana employs



hundreds of people, from all backgrounds and castes. She has met prominent businessmen such as Ratan Tata and Mukesh Ambani, and in 2006 won a prestigious award for her entrepreneurial spirit.

Kalpana regularly visits her home village and does charity work to help those in her community. As a Dalit and a woman, her story is all the more remarkable in a country where very few CEOs are from such a background.

"If you give your heart and soul to your job and never give up, things can happen for you," she says. It is a mantra that has helped Kalpana through the worst of times and still rings true for her.





Nileema Mishra

"Women Who Inspire"

When Nileema Mishra won the Magsaysay Award (also hailed as the Asian Noble Prize, instituted in the memory of erstwhile President of Philippines,

Ramon Magsaysay), this able lady known for some great pioneering work in the villages in Jalgaon and known in the narrow confines in the state of Maharashtra, in a way obscure, has come in to national limelight, nay international limelight.

Magsaysay Award Foundation while announcing the Winner proclaimed, "She is being recognized for her purpose-driven zeal to work tirelessly with villagers in Maharashtra, India, organizing them to successfully address both their aspirations and their adversities through collective action and heightened confidence in their potential to improve their own lives".



Facts about 39 year old Nileema Misra reads like, she was born to a middle class family having an abiding interest in social welfare and public activities, in the village of Bahadarpur, Maharashtra. She went on to Pune and pursued Master's Degree in Clinical Psychology. Though she could have easily become an urban professional and lead a comfortable life, she returned to her native place Bahadarpur with a dream to transform the lives of downtrodden women in her village.

As a child she was distressed with the all-round poverty prevalent in her village, farmer suicides, plight of widows and old aged and at a tender age of about 13 years, she decided not to marry and dedicate her life to the welfare and upliftment of people. Thus when she returned with the same resolute in 1995, it didn't take her much time to realize that the biggest problem stemmed from basic fact-lack of money in the hands of the rural families and plunged head long in to social service by starting Bhagini Nivedita Gramin Vigyan Niketan (BNGVN) on a humble scale of about a dozen women who were more vulnerable in an impoverished society.



Today the movement has more than 10000 women in various Self-Help groups, engaging in microcredit, production of food products and export quality quilts. BNGVN also help in training the rural women folks in income-generating products and further helps in marketing, accounting, computer literacy, procurement in bulk at better prices, building warehouses etc.



What a great resolve at such a tender age of 13, to realize the dreams of our Father of Nation Mahatma Gandhi to create self-sufficient village communities! When this village girl could have been dreaming about bangles and bindis, jewelry and colourful dresses, fashion and cinema etc this kid was dreaming of transforming the lives of her fellow village folks crippled in poverty. Amazed, what I could only draw a parallel immediately in my mind, is the late Kalpana Chawla who as an young child looked at stars dreamt that one day she will go to space and she achieved it and created history and become immortal, this great Indian-American Astronaut remains an icon for present and future generations. Nileema Mishra will achieve still greater heights and become a example for numerous others to emulate.

Her father Chandrasekhar Mishra, a retired a retired School Headmaster and now a Trustee of RK Mishra High school in Bahadarpur and her mother a social activist. Like any father he wanted to marry her but found Nileema very resolute that she will not marry and wanted to dedicate her life to help the downtrodden women of her village. It naturally made him sad but left her daughter to pursue her dreams. Now this award has made her father proud that Nileema has been recognized at such a young age and it is a testimony that she is proceeding in the right direction in her

chosen domain.

All this has not come without challenges. When in the year 2000 Nileema wanted funds very badly to take her activities to the next level, she without any hesitation sold hers mother's ancestral jewels to garner about 3 lacs and thus created revolving funds to start new incomegenerating schemes as well as building basic infrastructure like computers. No big deal for



Nileema who even when she was a kid saved her pocket money to give it to poor village folks.

She had already announced that the 22 lacs she would receive as prize money would go to fund fund further activities. She received the prestigious medal and certificate in a spectacular function in Philippines on 31-Aug-11 and has brought along with that international focus and attention to Jalgaon.

In Nileema's words, her education in Clinical Psychology has helped clear negative thoughts and focus on social work. Nileema and her group's activities encompass wider issues like health problems faced by rural villages by building 300 odd private and communal toilets.

She went in for the micro-finance route for uplifting the financial status of women is very noteworthy at a time when this sector is being accused of commercial exploitation and coercions leading to even suicides in the state of Andhra Pradesh. Though micro-




finance started as a very noble venture for rural transformation, it has got commercial overtones and over the period has lost sight of its lofty goals and has become yet another flourishing profit-mongering industry interested in profits alone.

But given the glaring fact that present day banks are yet to come out with a special rural platform for financial inclusion of the impoverished rural lot, these micro-finance

companies will alone be the refuge of the rural India despite all shortcomings. But let the micro-finance institutions take a few leaves out of Nileema Mishra's prodigal work and realign their priorities to provide a viable, sustainable and a compassionate business model which will make rural communities more self-reliant and prosperity which will go a long way to alleviate poverty as well as to the GDP of our nation.

Riddhiraj stands the Youngest Indian ever to make a Space talk (International Space Station) in the Space with Ms.Sunita Williams. This program was

conducted in India with the Technical Support from NASA.

As the President of ICS, Kuwait, I have led him to a child prodigy, aged 5 -a UKG student in Kuwait and gave him platform. Thousands of audiences witnessed about his UNIQUE talent while performed in "Bappi Lahiri Live Concert" presented by ICS Kuwait on 5th Oct. 2012 says Mr. Ashfaque A Khan.

The highpoint of Riddhiraj's talent is his ability to identify the flags of all the nations in the world and describe them. His amazing spatial skills enable him to recognize the maps of all the countries in the world in addition to identifying their locations in

relationship to other countries. But what may bowl over some of us is Riddiraj's talent to identify Indian states simply by feeling the shapes of their maps blindfolded.

This prodigy has already drawn the attention of his teachers and principal and thousands

of others who happened to witness a demonstration of his skills on various stages in India.

His humongous appetite for knowledge began as early as 1 ½ years, when his mother (Krupa Swayaraj) discovered a hint to his unbelievable potential. Since the accidental discovery came when little Riddhiraj identified the flag of Egypt, his mother focused on teaching him the flags of the world, which he absorbed voraciously, mastering them all by the time he was 2 1/2. Today, he is so thorough with the names of countries and their flags that he can shoot loads of information on them at the slightest prompt.

Riddhiraj can identify flags of 210 countries in under 3:30 min. His name has been nominated with the Guinness

 - 7) Name any alphabet and He will list all the countries of that alphabet

He was born in India (Gujarat) on 3rd April 2007. At present living in Kuwait with his parents and studying in class U.K.G. He loves to know more about Solar Systems, Planets and Space. His dream is to visit NASA-USA and he wants to his best to become an Astronaut.



Dr. V. Shantha

Awards winner & Chairperson of Adyar Cancer Institute, Chennai

Dr.V. Shantha is a prominent Cancer specialist and the Chairperson of Adyar Cancer Institute, Chennai. Her career which spans over 50 years has been dedicated to organising care for cancer patients, and intensive research in the prevention and cure of the disease. Her work has been widely acknowledged with several awards including the Magsaysay Award, and Padma Shri.

Dr. Shantha has been associated with Adyar Cancer Institute since 1955, and has held several key positions, including its Director between 1980-1997. She is a member of the World Health Organisation's Advisory Committee on Health

and several other national and international committees on health and medicine.

Dr. Shantha was born on March 11, 1927 at Mylapore, Chennai. She was born into an illustrious family of academics and scientists, most eminent among them were Nobel Laureates C.V. Raman and S. Chandrasekar.

When Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy set up the Cancer Institute in 1954, Dr. Shantha then 709 had just finished her Doctor of Medicine (M.D.). She also got through the Public Service Commission examination and was posted to the Women and Children Hospital.

Dr. Shantha had to make a crucial decision and decided to join the Cancer Institute instead, upsetting many people. For three years she worked as honorary staff after which, the Institute offered to pay her Rs.200 per month and residence within the campus. She moved into the campus on April 13, 1955, and has remained there ever since.

The Institute began with two doctors, Krishnamurthy and Shantha, a single building with minimal diagnostic and therapeutic facilities and a cluster of 12 huts to house the inpatients. The only cancer hospital in south India, it was established with public donations

as a voluntary, charitable and non-profitable institution.

"It was a very difficult journey. Finances were hard to come by and daily existence was a struggle. It was a frustrating and painful period because people did not understand us. The first thing people asked me those days was, 'Where were you trained?' My reply, 'Here in India, in Madras,' did not



make many happy!" recalls Dr. Shantha, who took over as the Institute's director and chairperson when Dr. Krishnamurthy retired in 1979.

Dr. Shantha tries to lead by example and feels that if doctors worked in a corporate setup, they would probably earn three to four times the salary they are drawing here. "It is certainly disheartening when you see them go, but then they are spreading the message of the Institute elsewhere. Those who stay behind are committed to the cause." Dr. Shantha cannot be identified apart from her institution. She took over the cancer hospital 25 years ago and is as devoted to it as she was when she joined in 1954. She doesn't think of a life beyond the institution. Service is of primary concern and working for a cause seems to be-the-be-all-and-end-all for this noble lady.

Awards don't seem to distract her dedication though she has quite a few to her credit. She was honoured by the Belgium-based International Network for Cancer Treatment and Research (INCTR) with the Award for Outstanding Work in a Country with Limited Resources. CURE Foundation Award Presentation during its inaugural function honoured doctors from India and abroad. Dr. V. Shantha, Adyar Cancer Institute was the Indian awardee. Last but not the least has been the Magsaysay Award (2005), another feather in the cap of this committed doctor. Her selfless service is an inspiration to all of humanity.

It was an unexpected, pleasant surprise for the doctor when the president of the Ramon Magsaysay Award Committee called her from the Philippines to inform her of the award. The president said, "We have just finished the meeting and you have been chosen.

"Dr Shantha had no words to express her feelings. She just said, "I am honoured and privileged." She still has no idea who suggested her name to the committee. The staffs at the hospital are exhilarated; they look at the award as their own, which makes Dr Shantha even more proud and happy.



"The award is theirs too, as we are one family." Dr. Shantha has dedicated the award to the institute, saying that there "is a long way to go". The award citation is worth quoting to describe aptly Shanta's service. It reads: "In an era when specialised medical care in India has become highly commercialised, Dr. Shanta strives to ensure that the Institute remains true to its

ethos, `Service to all.' Its services are free or subsidised for some 60 per cent of its 100,000 annual patients; travel allowances make regular treatments accessible to the poor.

Recently Tamil Nadu Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa presented the 'Avvaiyar Award' for the year 2013 to Dr Shanta on the occasion of International Women's Day.

And through a volunteer programme called Sanctuary, the Institute provides hopegiving emotional support and counselling to patients and their families and to cancerafflicted children.



Dr. V. Shantha commented that 76 per cent of the movies show tobacco in some

form and 50 per cent of the time the hero is shown smoking. She appealed to cine stars not to smoke on screen since they set a bad example to young filmgoers. Speaking at a function organized by WHO on "Tobaccofree films and fashion," Kamal Hassan swore that he would never again wield a cigarette before the camera.



There was conceived an innovative fundraising campaign "Iruvadhu Muthal Iruvadhu

Varai", to collect Rs. 20 from the public till the target of Rs. 20 crores was reached by the Cancer Institute. It was launched to facilitate the institute's expansion plans. It is not just about collecting money, but a way of creating awareness and generating hope and positive action among people about cancer.

Dr. Shantha's Quotes

"If we have grown, it is because of the grace of God, and our faith in our mission". The journey has been long. I don't see an end to it, simply because our work is never ending. What we have done is very little. There is much more to do.

The journey has been arduous, with bricks and stones and occasional flowers strewn 111 in between, but we continue..." "When the sick approach the gates of the Institute, weak in body and spirit, and full of fear, there is only one response, you have to become part of them".

"Every obstacle I have overcome, every patient I have cured, every child I have treated who has grown, got married and come back to see me with his / her children have made my whole life memorable."

Higher Education in India

Education in India is seen as one of the ways to upward social mobility. Good education is seen as a stepping stone to a high flying career. Indian professionals are considered among the best in the world are in great demand. This signifies the inherent strength of Indian education system.

Higher Education in India has evolved in distinct and divergent streams with each stream monitored by an apex body, indirectly controlled by the Ministry of Human Resource Development. The engineering education and business schools are monitored and accredited by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) while medical education is monitored and accredited by the Medical Council of India (MCI). Like-wise, agriculture education and research is monitored by the Indian Council for Agriculture Research.

Apart from these, National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) controls all the teacher training institutions in the country. The country has some world-class engineering, management and medical education institutions which are directly funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Union Government. Admission to all professional education colleges is done through all-India common admission tests of which the IIT-JEE, AIEEE, CAT and CPMT are the most popular ones. Most of the institutions reserve a small percentage of seats for foreign students.

University Grants Commission (UGC) is responsible for coordination, determination and maintenance of standards and release of grants. Professional Councils are responsible for recognition of courses, promotion of professional institutions and providing grants to undergraduate programmes and various awards. The statutory professional councils are:

All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Distance Education Council (DEC), Indian Council for Agriculture Research (ICAR), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), Medical Council of India (MCI), Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), Indian Nursing Council (INC), Dentist Council of India (DCI), Central Council of Homeopathy (CCH), Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM).

Central Government is responsible for major policy relating to higher education in the country. It provides grants to the UGC and establishes central universities in the country. The Central Government is also responsible for declaration of Educational Institutions as 'Deemed to be University' on the recommendation of the UGC.



Academic Qualification Framework - Degree Structure

There are three principle levels of qualifications within the higher education system in the country. These are:

Bachelor / Undergraduate level | Master / Post-graduate level | Doctoral / Pre-doctoral level

Bachelor's degree in arts, commerce and sciences is three years of education (after 12 years of school education). In some places there are honours and special courses available. These are not necessarily longer in duration but indicate greater depth of study. Bachelor degree in professional field of study in agriculture, dentistry, engineering, pharmacy, technology and veterinary medicine generally take four years, while architecture and medicine takes five and five and a half years respectively. There are other bachelor degrees in education, journalism and librarian-ship that are second degrees. Bachelor's degree in law can either be taken as an integrated degree lasting five years or three-year course as a second degree.

Master's degree is normally of two-year duration. It could be coursework based without thesis or research alone. Admission to postgraduate programmes in engineering and technology is done on the basis of Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering or Combined Medical Test respectively.

A pre-doctoral programme - Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) is taken after completion of the Master's Degree. This can either be completely research based or can include course work as well. Ph.D. is awarded two years after the M.Phil or three years after the Master's degree. Students are expected to write a substantial thesis based on original research.

Distance Education in India



In India there has been increase in students enrolling for distance learning courses. The admissions in regular University courses have become highly competitive due to limited number of seats available in specialized professional courses. Distance Education Council (DEC) is an organisation responsible for the promotion and coordination of the Open University and distance education system and for determination of its

standards in India.

The benefits of Distance Education are many, availability of distance learning courses has assured that a person can pursue distance education from any state or university that he or she desires and the employment market is highly competitive and the best jobs go to persons possessing requisite qualifications. In many organisations, getting promotions depend on the possession of higher qualifications. These courses provide them with the opportunity to enhance their qualifications. In particular, distance education is a boon to housewives, who can use their precious leisure time to enhance their educational qualifications and employment potential.

Distance education institutions offer courses at different levels: Degree, Postgraduate degree, Research degree, diploma and postgraduate diploma. The courses cover a wide variety of subjects from the traditional courses in Arts, Science and Commerce, both at degree and postgraduate degree levels, to a large number of professional courses like teacher's education, library and information science, journalism and mass communication, management (different branches), Information technology and several branches of science. The Distance Education courses provided from different universities is an added advantage for the working class people to upgrade their qualification.

Dr. Sugata Mitra- One of the Greatest Educationists of 21st Century


Jadav Payeng – Living example for Persistence and Devotion

If the BlackBerry leadership is thinking well beyond the smart-phone, Bhardwaj sets the tone for this move. "Tablets make no money," he says.


"We see the next evolution of the phone back into platform distribution. The real game is content and commerce, not hardware." And

She is currently ranked number three in the world, at a time when the Chinese are dominating the field.



Sunita Narain

Environmentalists have a lot to complain about in India, and Sunita Narain does her fair share. She can be acerbic and populist but there's no doubt that she draws attention to issues that need it. She has been with the Centre for Science and Environment since 1982. She is currently the director general of the Centre and publisher of Down To Earth. In 2005 she was awarded the Padma Shri.



Dr TK Anuradha

The recent PSLV C-17 mission saw the emergence of a woman scientist as the future face of India's space programmes. Dr TK Anuradha, 51, a scientist from Indian Space Research Organisation, Bangalore, became the country's first woman satellite fabricator. Anuradha and her colleagues designed and built the GSAT 12 satellite. For the first time in India's space history a woman scientist was in charge of a mission as complex as this.


Indian Nobel Prize winners

Sir C V Raman:

Sir Chandrasekhara VenkataRaman, FRS (7 November 1888 - 21 November 1970) was an Indian physicist whose work was influential in the growth of science in India. He was the recipient of the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1930 for the discovery that when light traverses a transparent material, some of the light that is deflected changes in wavelength. This phenomenon is now called Raman scattering and is the result of the Raman effect.




Rabindranath Tagore



Rabindranath Tagore (7 May 1861 - 7 August 1941), was a Bengali polymath who reshaped his region's literature and music. Author of Gitanjali and its "profoundly sensitive, fresh and beautiful verse", he became the first non-European to win the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1913.

Dr. Hargobind Khorana

Dr. Hargobind Khorana was born on 9th January 1922 at Raipur, Punjab (now in Pakistan). Dr. Khorana was responsible for producing the first man-made gene in his laboratory in the early seventies. This historic invention won him the Nobel Prize for Medicine in 1968 sharing it with Marshall Nuremberg and Robert Holley for interpreting the genetic code and analyzing its function in protein synthesis. They all independently made contributions to the understanding of the genetic code and how it works in the cell.



Dr. Subramaniam Chandrasekar

Subramaniam Chandrashekhar was born on October 19, 1910 in Lahore, India. He attended Presidency College from 1925 to 1930, following in the footsteps of his famous uncle, Sir C. V. Raman.

His work spanned over the understanding of the rotation of planets, stars, white dwarfs, neutron stars, black holes, galaxies, and clusters of galaxies. He won the Nobel Prize in 1983 for his theoretical work on stars and their evolution.

Mother Teresa (1910 - 1997)

Born in 1910, Skoplje, Yugoslavia (then Turkey) and originally named Agnes GonxhaBojaxhiu, Mother Teresa dedicated her life

to helping the poor, the sick, and the dying around the world, particularly those in India, working through the Missionaries Of Charity in Calcutta. The Society of Missionaries has spread all over the world, including the former Soviet Union and Eastern European countries. They provide effective help to the poorest of the poor in a number of countries in Asia, Africa, and Latin America, and they undertake relief work in the wake of natural catastrophes such as floods, epidemics, and famine, and for refugees. The order also has houses in North America, Europe and Australia, where they take care of the shut-ins, alcoholics, homeless, and AIDS sufferers. Mother Teresa died on September 5, 1997. She won the Nobel Prize for peace in 1979.



Dr. Amartya Sen

Born in 1933, Bolpur, in West Bengal, Amartya Sen is the latest in our list of Nobel Laureates. He was honored with the Nobel Prize in 1998 for his work in Welfare economics. When Thailand's Baht plummeted, markets from Bombay to New York were in turmoil and there was talk of worldwide depression, Sen's argument that growth should be accompanied by democratic decision-making seemed only too correct. Amidst the human suffering caused by mass unemployment and exacerbated - as many felt - by the stringent economic policies of the International Monetary Fund and ideas of



free-market capitalism, Sen's call for social support in development appeared humane and wise.

Some MEMORABLE Achievers

Dr A.P.J. Abdul Kalam

Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam (born on 15 October 1931) usually referred to as Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, is an Indian scientist and administrator who served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007. Kalam was born and raised in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu, studied physics at the St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli, and aerospace engineering at the Madras Institute of Technology (MIT), Chennai.



Before his term as President, he worked as an aerospace engineer with Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO). Kalam is popularly known as the Missile Man of India

for his work on the development of ballistic missile and launch vehicle technology. He played a pivotal organizational, technical and political role in India's Pokhran-II nuclear tests in 1998, the first since the original nuclear test by India in 1974. Some scientific experts have however called Kalam a man with no authority over nuclear physics but who just carried on the works of Homi J. Bhabha and Vikram Sarabhai.

Kalam was elected the President of India in 2002, defeating Lakshmi Sahgal and was supported by both the Indian National Congress and the BharatiyaJanata Party, the major political parties of India. He is currently a visiting professor at Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad and Indian Institute of Management Indore, Chancellor of the Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology Thiruvananthapuram, a professor of Aerospace Engineering at Anna University (Chennai), JSS University (Mysore) and an adjunct/visiting faculty at many other academic and research institutions across India.

Kalam advocated plans to develop India into a developed nation by 2020 in his book India 2020. Books authored by him have received considerable demands in South Korea for the translated versions. He has received several prestigious awards, including the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour. Kalam is known for his motivational speeches and interaction with the student community in India. He launched a mission for the youth of the nation in 2011 called "What Can I Give Movement" with a central theme to defeat corruption in India.

Viswanathan Anand

Viswanathan Anand (born on 11 December 1969) is an Indian chess Grandmaster and the current World Chess Champion. Anand has won the World Chess Championship five times (2000, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2012), and has been the undisputed World Champion



since 2007. Anand was the FIDE World Rapid Chess Champion in 2003, and is widely considered the strongest rapid player of his

generation.

Anand became India's first grandmaster in 1987. He was also the first recipient of the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award in 1991-92, India's highest sporting honour. In 2007, he was awarded India's second highest civilian award, the Padma Vibhushan, making him the first sportsperson to receive the award in



Indian history. Anand has won the Chess Oscar six times (1997, 1998, 2003, 2004, 2007 & 2008).

He held the FIDE World Chess Championship from 2000 to 2002, at a time when the world title was split. He became the undisputed World Champion in 2007 and defended his title against Vladimir Kramnik in 2008. He then successfully defended his title in the World Chess Championship 2010 against Veselin Topalov and in the World Chess Championship 2012 against Boris Gelfand.

He was at the top of the world rankings five out of six times, from April 2007 to July 2008, holding the number-one ranking for a total of 15 months.

Anna Hazare - Most trusted personality in India

Owing to his nationwide campaign against corruption, social activist Anna Hazare has emerged for the second consecutive time the most-trusted personality in India, a new survey has found. The survey, titled "The Brand Trust Report 2013', is carried out by the Trust Research Advisory.



Abhinav Bindra

Abhinav Singh Bindra (born on 28 September 1982, in Dehradun) is an Indian shooter and is a World and Olympic champion in the 10 m Air Rifle event. By winning the gold in the 10 m Air Rifle event at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games, he became the first Indian to win an individual gold medal at the Olympic Games. It was also India's first gold medal since 1980.

Lakshmi Mittal



Mittal owns 41 percent of Arcelor Mittal and holds a 34 percent stake in the Queens Park Rangers F.C. football team. Mittal is the richest man of Asian descent. Despite being the wealthiest man in Britain, he does not hold British citizenship. He was ranked the sixth richest person in the



world by Forbes in 2011, but dropped to 21st place in 2012, due to having lost \$10.4 billion the previous year. In spite of the drop, Forbes estimates that he still had a personal wealth of US\$16 billion in October 2012. He is also the 47th "most powerful person" of the 70 individuals named in Forbes' "Most Powerful People" list for 2012. His daughter Vanisha Mittal's wedding was the second most expensive in recorded history.

Mittal has been a member of the board of directors of Goldman Sachs since 2008 and is also member of the board of directors of the European Aeronautic Defence and Space Company. He sits on the World Steel Association's executive committee and is a member of the Indian Prime Minister's Global Advisory Council, the Foreign Investment Council in Kazakhstan, the World Economic Forum's International Business Council, and the Presidential International Advisory Board of Mozambique. He also sits on the advisory board of Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management in the United States and is a member of the board of trustees of the Cleveland Clinic, In 2006 The Sunday Times named him "Business Person of 2006", the Financial Times named him "Person of





the Year", and Time magazine named him "International Newsmaker of the Year 2006". In 2007, Time magazine included him in their "100 most influential persons in the world".

N R Narayana Murthy


Nagavara Ramarao Narayana Murthy, better known as N. R. Narayana Murthy, is an Indian businessman and co-founder of Infosys. Murthy started Infosys in 1981 and served as its CEO from 1981 to 2002. He served as the Chairman and Chief Mentor during 1981-2011. Under his leadership, Infosys was listed on NASDAQ in 1999. He is currently the Chairman Emeritus of Infosys. Mr. Murthy articulated,



designed and implemented the Global Delivery Model which has become the foundation for the huge success in IT services outsourcing from India. He has led key corporate governance initiatives in India. He is an IT advisor to several Asian countries.

He serves on the boards of Ford Foundation, Rhodes Trust, the Indian School of Business and the UN Foundation. He served as a member of the HSBC board between 2008 and 2012, Unilever board between 2007 and 2010, the Chairman of the International Institute of Information Technology, Bangalore between 2002 and 2012 and the Chairman of the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad between 2002 and 2007. He has also served on the boards of Cornell University, Singapore Management University, INSEAD (Paris), Wharton School and the Graduate School of Business at Stanford University.

Mr. Murthy was listed as one among the "12 greatest entrepreneurs of our time" by the Fortune magazine in 2012. The Economist ranked him among the ten most-admired global business leaders in 2005. He has been awarded the Padma Vibhushan by the Government of India, the Legion d'honneur by the Government of France, and the CBE by the British government. He is the first Indian winner of Ernst and Young's World Entrepreneur of the year award and the Max Schmidheiny Liberty prize. He has appeared in the rankings of businessmen and innovators published by BusinessWeek, Time, CNN, Fortune, India Today, Business Standard, Forbes and Financial Times. He is a Fellow of the Indian National Academy of Engineering and a foreign member of the U.S. National Academy of Engineering. He was awarded the 2012 Hoover Medal and the James C. Morgan Global Humanitarian Award 2012 by The Tech Museum, California. He received the 2007 Ernst Weber Medal from the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc., USA (IEEE). He has about 25 honorary doctorates from universities in India and abroad.

Indra Krishnamurthy Nooyi (born on 28 October 1955) is an Indian-American business executive and the current Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of PepsiCo, the second largest food and beverage business in the world by net revenue. According to Forbes, she is consistently ranked among World's 100 Most Powerful Women.

Nooyi is the architect of PepsiCo's long-term growth strategy called Performance with Purpose. The company wants to expand its business while it also expands its commitment to "investing in a healthier future for people



and the planet." The idea is to make PepsiCo products healthier and find innovative ways to reduce the use of energy, water and packaging to protect the environment.

A R Rehman - Legendary Musician

Born 6 January 1966 (as A. S. Dileep Kumar) is an Indian Tamil film composer, record producer, musician and singer. His film scoring career began in the early 1990s. He has won fourteen Filmfare Awards, four National Film Awards, a BAFTA Award, a Golden Globe, two Grammy Awards, and two Academy Awards. Working in India's various film industries, international cinema and theatre, by 2004, Rahman, in a career spanning over a decade, had sold more than 150 million records of his film scores and soundtracks worldwide, and sold over 200 million cassettes, making him one of the world's all-time top selling recording artists. Time



magazine has referred him as the "Mozart of Madras" and several Tamil commentators have coined him the nickname Isai Puyal.

Dr. Bhupen Hazarika - Legendary Musician & Singer

He was no less than a child prodigy who wrote his first song at the age of 10. A post graduate from BHU, he completed his PhD from US in 1954. He talked of using audio-visual in the basic format of education for adults then & it has taken almost same number of years yet the use of audio-visual is not implemented fully across India, although, planned by Government of India for many years now. He became very famous with his heart touching music in hindi movie "Rudaali". Some of his finest renditions are in the Video



Section. "O Ganga" is one that encompasses modern India's problems in a very poetic way.



Kalpana Chawla

Born in Karnal, India, on July 1, 1961, Chawla was the youngest of four children. The name Kalpana means "idea" or "imagination." She obtained a degree in aeronautical engineering from Punjab Engineering College before immigrating to the United States and becoming a naturalized citizen in the 1980s. She earned a doctorate in aerospace engineering from the University of Colorado in 1988, having previously obtained her masters degree from the University of Texas. She began working at NASA's Ames Research Center the same year, working on power-lift computational fluid dynamics.



In 1994, Chawla was selected as an astronaut candidate. After a year of training, she became a crew representative for the Astronaut Office EVA/Robotics and Computer Branches, where she worked with Robotic Situational Awareness Displays and tested software for the space shuttles. Chawla's first opportunity to fly in space came in November 1997, aboard the space shuttle Columbia on flight STS-87. The shuttle made 252 orbits of the Earth in just over two weeks. The shuttle carried a number of experiments and observing tools on its trip, including a Spartan satellite, which Chawla deployed from the shuttle.

Dr. Binayak Sen - Public Health & Human Rights Activist

A paediatrician by profession, Dr Sen started working for the poor to extend medical facility during his early days in medicine, championed the cause of the rural poor especially in the remotest places that inhabits the adivasis, as a Human rights activist, later on. He voiced strongly against the Salwa Judum. While he condemns strongly the violent methods employed by the Maoists, he equally puts the government in the docks for not doing enough for the welfare of the rural tribal. He was convicted by a local trial court on the charges of sedition for life



imprisonment however was later granted bail by the Supreme Court of India in Aug 2007. He serves as a member of the 40 member strong steering committee on Health of Planning commission of Government of India. He also serves as the National Vice President of PUCL, Peoples Union for Civil Liberties.

Dr Sunitha Krishnan - Social Activist & Reformer

A Lady who herself has a harrowing tale to tell but instead picked it up & fought with this indifferent society to come winner. Born in 1969, she is an Indian social activist and chief functionary and co-founder of Prajwala, an institution that assists trafficked women and girls find shelter. The organization also helps pay for the education of five



thousand children infected with HIV/AIDS in Hyderabad. Prajwala's "second-generation" prevention program operates in 17 transition centers and has served thousands of children of prostituted mothers. The NGO's strategy is to remove women from brothels by giving their children educational and career opportunities. Krishnan and her staff train survivors in carpentry, welding, printing, masonry and housekeeping. She admitted that rescuing girls is never a very safe business, sharing that she can no longer hear out of her right ear, and that she has been



beaten up during interventions more than a dozen times. Her strong voice and powerful body language ensured that no one could claim to have misunderstood her points.

Binalakshmi Nepram - Writer & Disarmament Activist

She was voted as one of the 50 most promising young Indians bringing change in the Society by "The Week" magazine in 2008. Hailing from Manipur, she has authored 3 books so far on disarmament, a thought that aroused from the Impact of Gun violence on women in Manipur. She is co-founder of Control Arms Foundation of India & founder of "Manipur Women Gun Survivor network". The network provides Legal, Financial & Medical assistance to the affected women as most of them come from financially poor background. She has represented India on various UN meetings to discuss disarmament. She has



won many accolades & awards globally including CNN-IBN Indian of the Year award in 2011. Her work is mainly on Civil disarmament.

Dr. Suryakant Patjoshi - To the tribal, this doctor is a 'Bhagaban'

An estimated 60,000 tribals from 24 panchayats in Korukonda block were in tears when Dr. Suryakant Patjoshi was relieved as the medical officer of the Public Health Centre at Korukonda, about 20 km from Malkangiri, in 2008. For the people of Potrel, Gongalaguda, Koyaguda, Siraguda, Mohulput, Bonur and other hamlets in the area, he had become a god for rendering yeoman service.

Tribal people here not only hold him in high regard but have also built an ashram in his honour to promote education and health awareness in this district, known as a hotbed of Maoist activities. "Bhagaban Sir is not a human but for all



of us is a real god. He would spend his own money on patient care and go to villages regularly on a bicycle or a motorbike," recalls Bansidhar Muduli, vice-chairman of the Malkangiri Zilla Parishad. Bhagaban Sir is against raising contributions from outside. He



himself contributes half of his salary and comes here during holidays to conduct medical camps. We also contribute from our savings," he explains.

Dr. Patjoshi told he was doing nothing great. "I feel it is my duty and my dream is to set up a modern hospital on the compound of the ashram," he discloses.

Bachendri Pal

Bachendri Pal was born in May 24, 1954 in a village called Nakuri in Garhwal to parents – Shri Kishan Singh Pal and Smt. Hansa Devi. From her early childhood, Bachendri Pal was a strong-spirited child - full of zip - and excelled in both academics and sports. Bachendri Pal earned a coveted place for herself in Indian history by becoming the first Indian woman to summit the Mount Everest, the highest mountain peak in the world. A free-willing, fearless, and adventure-loving girl, Bachendri always dreamt of being a mountaineer. By dint of her hard



work and sheer determination, Bachendri Pal created history when she successfully summited the Everest, thereby becoming the first Indian woman to achieve the big feat. Currently, Bachendri Pal is employed with Tata Steel where she conducts high-altitude training workshops for the corporate workforce.

Man of the Millennium

Mr.Kalayanasundaram worked as a Librarian for 30 years. Every month in his 30 year experience (service), he donated his entire salary to help the needy. He worked as a server in a hotel to meet his needs. He donated even his pension amount of about ten lakh rupees to the needy.

He is the first person in the world to spend the entire earnings for a social cause. In recognition to his service, the American government honoured him with the 'Man of the Millennium' award. He received a sum of Rs 30 crores as part of this award which he distributed entirely for the needy as usual.

Moved by his passion to help others, Super Star Rajinikanth adopted him as his father. He still stays as a bachelor and dedicated his entire life for serving the society.



Nauroti - Dalit woman makes history in Rajasthan

From a stone cutter in Puharu village to a sarpanch of Rajasthan's Harmada gram panchayat, Narouti has waged an unrelenting battle for empowering the marginalised. Four kilometers from the famous village of Tilonia is Harmada. A land of freedom fighters, Harmada today has a dalit woman sarpanch -- Nauroti.

This plucky woman had earned a name in the region for her struggle against injustice long before she was elected to this post a few years back. As she walks towards you, bare foot and clad in a simple inexpensive sari, Nauroti is a picture of humility but the moment you start talking to her you know that she is no ordinary woman and no ordinary sarpanch either.



Born in a poor dalit family she has struggled to make both odds meet and has always continued her unrelenting battle for empowerment of the marginalised. As sarpanch, she waged a battle against the daru (alcohol) mafia and stopped encroachment of the graveyard in Harmara. She has been working tirelessly to get approval for development projects in the region and has achieved a lot in the past two and a half years. Nauroti says that there are two things she can never tolerate -- injustice and dishonesty. When it came to her notice that a mate working for a project of the Mahatama Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme was committing fraud, she immediately took action. Despite resistance from many quarters, she did not stop till the person was jailed.

Resul Pookutty

Resul Pookutty (born in 1971) is a film sound designer, sound editor and mixer. He, along with Richard Pryke and Ian Tapp won the Academy Award for Best Sound Mixing for the

film Slumdog Millionaire. He has worked in Hollywood, Hindi, Tamil and Malayalam films. Born in a family in Vilakkupara, near Punalur about 58 km from Kollam, Kerala. He was the youngest of eight children born to an impoverished family. His father was a private bus ticket checker. Pookutty had to walk 6 km to the nearest school and study in the light of a kerosene lamp as his village had no electricity.



Pookutty made his debut in sound design with the 1997 film Private Detective: Two Plus Two Plus One, directed by Rajat Kapoor. He got his big break with the critically acclaimed

2005 film Black, directed by Sanjay Leela Bhansali. He subsequently engineered sound for major productions like Musafir (2004), Zinda (2006), Traffic Signal (2007), Gandhi, My Father (2007), Saawariya (2007) and DusKahaniyaan (2007). He designed sound for the 2008 blockbuster Ghajini, starring Aamir Khan and directed by Murugadoss. His first major international project Slumdog Millionaire won him an Academy award. His work on the film also won him nation-wide acclaim.



Aishwarya Rai

Aishwarya Rai is an Indian film actress and model. She won the Miss India and Miss World pageants of 1994, and has received two Film fare Awards, two Screen Awards, and two IIFA Awards for her performances in Hindi films of Bollywood. She is a leading contemporary actress of Indian cinema and is often cited in the media as the "most beautiful woman in the world".

Rai made her acting debut in the 1997 biographical film Iruvar and starred in the commercially successful 1998 film Jeans. She received wide public recognition and several Best Actress awards for her leading roles in Sanjay Leela





Mr. Datta was awarded the Professor Jagadish Chandra Bose Memorial Gold Medal for the best academic performance among the outgoing students for the two-year post graduate course in science at the 58th convocation of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur.

"I could not even write a simple mathematical formula, all I did was remembering it.

I do all the calculations mentally and then dictate it to my scribe, who puts it down on paper," 23-yearold Datta said, after being awarded the degree in Mathematics by the institute. His cumulative grade point average was 9.87 — higher than any other M.Sc student at the IIT. Mr. Datta has enrolled in a Ph.D. programme on Cryptology and Network Security at IIT Kharagpur. In the last two years at the institute, Mr. Datta has amazed his teachers with his ability.

Shakuntala Devi was born on 4 November in 1939 at the city of Bangalore in Karnataka state, Shakuntala Devi is an outstanding calculating prodigy of India. It was once while she was playing cards with her father at the age of three that it was discovered that she is a calculating genius. It turn out that she beat him not by slight of the hand, but by memorizing the cards.



When Shakuntala Devi was six years old, she demonstrated her calculation skills at the University of Mysore. And by the time, she was 8 years old, she had again proved herself successful at Annamalai University by doing the same. However despite apprehensions from some quarters, Shakuntala Devi did not lose her calculating ability with the setting in of adulthood like other prodigies such as Truman Henry Safford.

On the other hand, in the year 1977, Shakuntala Devi obtained the 23rd root of the digit number '201' mentally. On 18 June in 1980, she again solved the multiplication of two 13-digit numbers 7,686,369,774,870 x 2,465,099,745,779 that were randomly picked by the computer department of Imperial College in London. And this, she did in 28 seconds flat. Her correct answer to this multiplication sum was 18,947,668,177,995,426,462,773,7 30. This incident has been included on the 26th page of the famous 1995 Guinness Book of Records.

Ms. Naina Parasher - PAWS Kuwait, appreciates Indian student


"We wanted to break from the tradition of involving visually disabled people in cane work,






About the Author
